

PAHUD WINS FIRST PRO INEX LEGENDS RACE

Harrisburg, N.C. ó Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development racer Christian PaHud won his first INEX Legends Pro class feature event Sunday at the first competitive racing event at North Carolina Speedway since February 2004. The 14-year-old talent also competed in round four of the Winter Heat Series at Loweø Motor Speedwayø 1-mile infield road course on Saturday, finishing fourth.

PaHud won on North Carolina Speedwayø six-turn infield road course and led all 12 laps on his way to the triumph. øWe were disappointed to finish fourth at Loweø yesterday because we had a better car than that. We wanted to come out today and stay clean and be consistent. Being my first Pro win and the first race at Rockingham in years today is pretty special. I want to thank my parents, Dan Snyder, Team Full Throttle and everyone involved with our team.ö

A former WKA Manufacturerø Cup champion, PaHud relies on the road racing skills he learned in that series to assist him in his efforts on the road courses the INEX Legends compete on. øI love road racing. I enjoy the shifting and physical aspect of it. You have to put every corner together to make a good lap, and then be as consistent as you can. I think the road courses bring out a different style of driving than the oval, but in the end you have to be consistent, just like on an oval.ö

PaHud, an Ohio native who now resides in Harrisburg, N.C., will be looking for his second Pro class victory this Saturday when race five of the Winter Heat Series takes place at Loweø Motor Speedway in Charlotte. If all goes well Saturday, heøll make the trek to Rockingham again on Sunday for the second of their two race winter series.
