PAHUD THIRD FRIDAY AT CONCORD; FOUR RACES IN FOUR DAYS PLANNED THIS WEEKEND

CONCORD, N.C. – Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development racer Christian PaHud started on the pole and finished third Friday night in the 20-lap Pro Legends car race at Concord Motorsport Park. Sunday's race at Concord was cancelled due to thunderstorms in the Charlotte area.

“Usually when we start on the pole we expect to win,” PaHud said, referring to Friday's third-place finish. “We led the first half of the race but the car got really tight and a couple of cars got by us. At Concord we run against the best of the best, so finishing third with a tight racecar is still a decent night for us.”

Last weekend could be thought of as “the calm before the storm” for PaHud's team. This week, he will race four times in four nights beginning with Thursday night's NASCAR Pole Night at Lowe's Motor Speedway's quarter-mile oval.

“It'll be cool to run four nights in a row. We've got a new car we wanted to run this weekend but it's not going to be ready. We'll take the car we've been running to Lowe's Thursday and hopefully do well. It's kind of a tune up for the Summer Shootout so we'll be looking to do the best we can.”

After Thursday night, PaHud's Kyle Beattie Racing team will compete locally at Concord Friday, followed by a trip to Georgia for back-to-back races at Lanier National Speedway Saturday and Sunday.
